Harrogate PFAC/ HOA update

- Harrogate HOA has set up a team to develop a testing plan for the community and are looking for volunteer to participate in the 'experiment'

- Some residents are making changes in the mulch surrounding their homes to deter the phorid flies as we are 'on our own' this year

NGT update

- PA State Rep. Eric Roe will be at the New Garden Township Building on April 20 and all are encouraged to make him aware of the phorid fly issue.

- The Township are ramping up inspections on property maintenance

- No grant money has been provided yet

- Tony is following up on the PA DEP reports from the 2016 inspections of mushroom houses (as per M. Zuk)

- Tony provided an email string from G.Emery/ T.baker regarding phorid flies in Florida

Update from Fred Strathmeyer, PA Dept of Agriculture

- There is no update on the availability of PHOR-EX for use in the mushroom houses

Update from Penn State Extension

- PSU are trying to determine where the flies are in the various seasons, and their behavior patterns

- they are testing 7 different pesticides to determine effectiveness

- 3 posters have been developed for placing in mushroom houses showing Insect Pests, Virus Disease, Fungal Pathogens and their impact on the mushroom growers

Chester County Conservation District update

- the mushroom houses adjacent to Harrogate have been doing a trial on growing organic mushrooms and this has meant virtually no spraying of pesticides

American Mushroom Institute update

- a grant application has been filed for Integrated Pest Management educational training

- there is no update on the availability or use of PHOR-EX
