PFAC welcomes all residents who are suffering from this fly invasion of their homes. We support and take action in defense of our property, we offer and assist government agencies, state officials, community organizations, and academic research in the eradication of this infestation. News and Social Media - Membership of the Facebook Public group is now 418 with no activity in the past two months. Status on items from PSU students in the field - Planned/ Controlled Trials are in progress in mushroom houses (not Kaolin) to evaluate the use of the organic insecticide and determine an application strategy. There are two different types of treatment being tested in conjunction with control houses. The measure being monitored is 'how quickly the phorid population gets to peak'. - Very little fly activity being seen at the houses in the trials other than sciarid flies. - These insecticides being used in the trials are organic and therefore. if successful, will be able to be used in the mushroom industry without additional label changes. - Research on the pheromones continues at PSU. Update from E Toedter on Kaolin Mushrooms progress - No update. Harrogate PFAC/ HOA update - There are no reports of phorids in the Harrogate community this year. - The last two years (2017/2018) the numbers of phorids counted showed a

significant increase in the last week of May and first week of June, so we are

approaching these dates.
